Proposed intersessional work plan to develop a CMM on Crew Labour Standards in 2024

Dear All,

New Zealand has advised that Sarah McAvinchey is no longer available to continue as co-Chair of the intersessional work to develop a conservation and management measure on crew labour standards, due to other national priorities. On behalf of CCMs and observers, the Secretariat takes this opportunity to thank Sarah for her valuable contributions to this important work.

New Zealand has offered the nomination of Heather Ward to take over from Sarah in the role of co-Chair. Unless I receive any objections from any CCM by 29 March, it will be presumed that Heather is confirmed in the role of co-Chair, alongside co-Chair Putuh Suadela (Indonesia).

In an effort to begin intersessional work shortly so as to meet the Commission's commitment to adopting a CMM on crew labour standards at WCPFC21, the co-Chairs have developed the attached work plan for 2024. The work plan includes two one-day virtual workshops to consider the draft CMM on crew labour standards:

- 17 April: First virtual workshop
- 19 June: Second virtual workshop

In addition, the co-Chairs propose to convene a hybrid session during the 20*th* Technical and Compliance Committee in September, the details of which will be provided in due course.

The co-Chairs intend for there to be opportunities throughout the year for CCMs and observers to provide comments on the draft CMM and these will be further elaborated at the first virtual workshop in April. Views are also welcomed in advance of the April workshop and should be directed to the co-Chairs, Heather Ward (<u>Heather.Ward@mpi.govt.nz</u>) and Putuh Saudela (<u>putuhsuadela@gmail.com</u>), with a copy to the Secretariat (<u>wcpfc@wcpfc.int</u>).
